LETTER FROM PASTOR CATHIE

As I write this letter, the sun is shining outside and the sky is a sweet shade of blue, and so it seems right to be writing the “spring” letter for the Bethel Light today. But it is also very chilly today with a forecast of snow this weekend, so it also seems a little strange to be thinking about spring just yet. But this is the season we are in- and this is the way it plays out in Pittsburgh. In these late winter and early spring months, we will go back and forth between spring-like weather that brings the buds popping up prematurely from garden beds, and cold snowy and slushy days that send us all inside to warm up and hunker down. * This total includes the 7% withdrawal of \$60,419 and an extra endowment withdrawal of \$126,199 in order to balance the budget and was approved by Session on 12/19/2023.

Per Capita for 2024 is \$36.35 per member. Based on the number of active members, the amount BPC is responsible for is \$7,633.50. However, Presbytery allows for a 5% discount if paid by January 31, 2024. This invoice in the amount of \$7,251.82 was paid on January 16, 2024. Please consider paying your portion either in one lump sum or you may spread it out over several months.
