Note: My Tribute was written in 1971 by Andrae Crouch after a conversation with a man named Larry, an ex-convict he had met while he was working as a counselor at Teen Challenge. Larry encouraged Andrae to read John, Chapter 17, where Jesus prays "Father, glorify me with your own self with the glory which I had with you before the world was." Thinking about these words, Larry's story of recovery and God's work in his own life, Crouch joyfully said, "It's all about GLORY!" This song was his response.
